## **PEACE**

I had the opportunity to attend a classical piano recital at UCO this week. I couldn't help but marvel at how the composer's creation could be perfectly preserved reproduced several hundred years later. We must be diligent about our desire for it, we must search for it, and when we catch a glimpse, we must follow after it.

Every good quest requires a starting place and a singleness of purpose. CS Lewis said "God cannot give us peace and happiness apart from Himself because there is no such thing". Christ himself is the source and the beginning of our search for peace.

We have families coming to our city and perhaps to our church who undoubtedly know the preciousness of peace. They have risked more than we can imagine to seek peace for their families. I think we can and will learn much from them. We pray they will find peace and happiness here in their new home.

My prayer for them and for all of us is that we find and recreate the beautiful music of perfect peace and harmony our creator intended for us.
